




Oriel progress, 2023/24

- July 2023 Breaking ground ceremony.
- September 2023 Museum of London Archaeology concluded their onsite excavations work, sharing via blogs, webinars and an audio book.
- January 2024 The site's underground work was completed and the building started emerging from the ground. It reached level two by the end of March 2024.

Moorfields Private

- Moorfields Private is the fifth largest NHS private patient unit in the UK
- On average we are rated 4.7 out of 5 and we were private Hospital of the Year in the Doctify Patient Voice Awards
- All our financial surplus is re-invested back into Moorfields for the benefit of all our patients.







Moorfields Education

- 17% more courses across 26 subjects, for doctors, nurses and optometrists
- 13% increase in revenue
- Continued success of hybrid courses flagship macula course extended to four days, with 33% increase in attendance

 Eleven in this year's Power List, two in top 20








Performance – A&E and cancer targets
